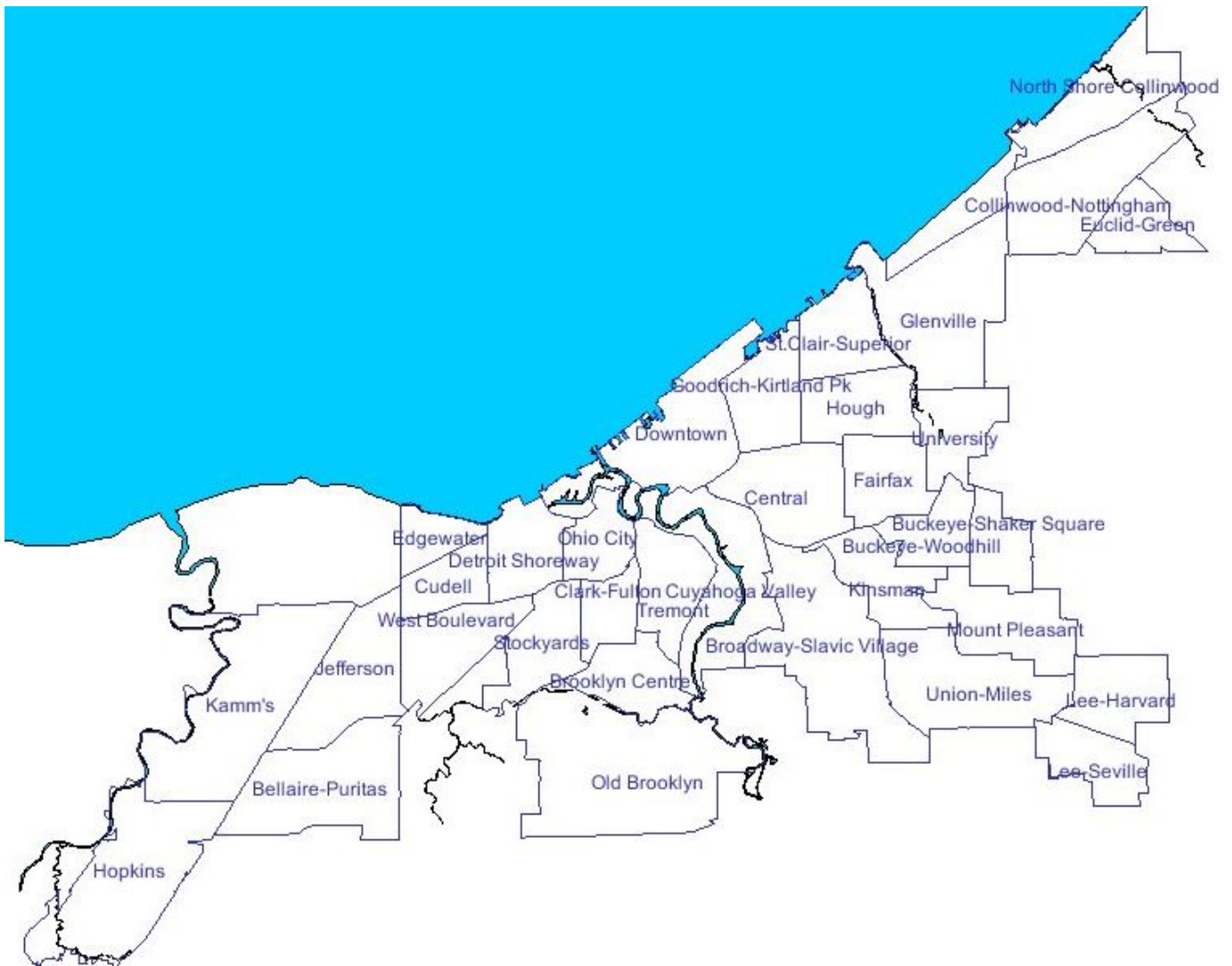

Affordable Housing: prioritize housing-related funding on maintaining and creating rental housing and homeownership opportunities, through rehabilitation and new construction activities.					
Homelessness: provide funds to the nonprofit organizations through a competitive process, to further the goals of preventing and ending homelessness and rapidly returning people who have become homeless to housing.					
Non-homeless Persons with Special Needs: focus programs and services on the frail elderly, persons with physical disabilities, persons with developmental disabilities, and persons with HIV/AIDS to enable them to remain within the conventional housing market whenever possible.					
Stabilizing Neighborhood Housing Markets: invest in neighborhoods for market recovery through demolition when appropriate, rehabilitation of older housing stock, and market-rate new construction.					
Community Development other than Housing: revitalize commercial/industrial areas with infrastructure/public service investments and economic development programs, address problem properties, and support the community development corporation network (CDCs), to retain and attract residents and offer a desirable environment for businesses to invest and retain/expand employment.					
Public Housing: Support the modernization and preservation of public housing in the City of Cleveland.
